BACKGROUND HISTORY OF HASTINGS RILEY

The car was originally built by Johnny Osborne of Far Mills, New Jersey and was a Blue No 9 with a Miller-Schofield head for a Model "A" block. Osborne ran the car for the first time with Syd Pershouse of Pluckemin, Jew Jersey during the tail end of the 1933 season.

The car was extensively damaged and Osworth did a complete rebuild job replacing the Schofield with a Winfield Flathead.
